born in Skopje in
1910.**



At the age of 12 she made a decision to become a nun.



She was trained in Dublin for a few months so she would become a right, fair, clever nun.



Latter the church sent her to Calcutta, in 1931. There, she attended St. Mary's High School until 1946.



But latter she stopped going to school and started helping the poor.



She spent all of her life helping the poor and the hungry.



She built hospitals and centers for the poor to live in, eat, sleep and recover from illnesses.



At the Nobel Prize winning ceremony in 1979, where she wore her famous blue sari, she asked the Nobel organization not to have a dinner for her honour but to use the money to feed 400 poor children in India for a year.



In 1997 she caught pneumonia and when she died some time later famous people from all over the world came to pay their respects to a brilliant and brave woman.
